

KEY RESULTS



- Generally a positive attitude towards mining concerning the importance of the sector for the whole **economy**, the chances for **employment** and being **independent by mining resources** in the own country.
- People see a benefit for the **local infrastructure** and facilities when it comes to mining.
- Mineral exploration: for **drone and helicopter use**, people are generally not bothered.




- Impact on **environment** caused by mining is seen as a huge issue.
- For mineral exploration **noise** might be a problem when a helicopter flies near the ground, as well as **privacy issues** when a drone examines the ground, and takes photographs.
- A stable **10 to 15 %** of the population show a very critical and very negative attitude towards mining and mineral exploration.




- **Citizens' opinion varies:** trust and acceptance towards mining industry and how public authorities handle mining issues
